The girls have a lot of questions for their parents, but it's time for bed. Queen Iduna sings a song and the girls go to sleep.



Years later ...

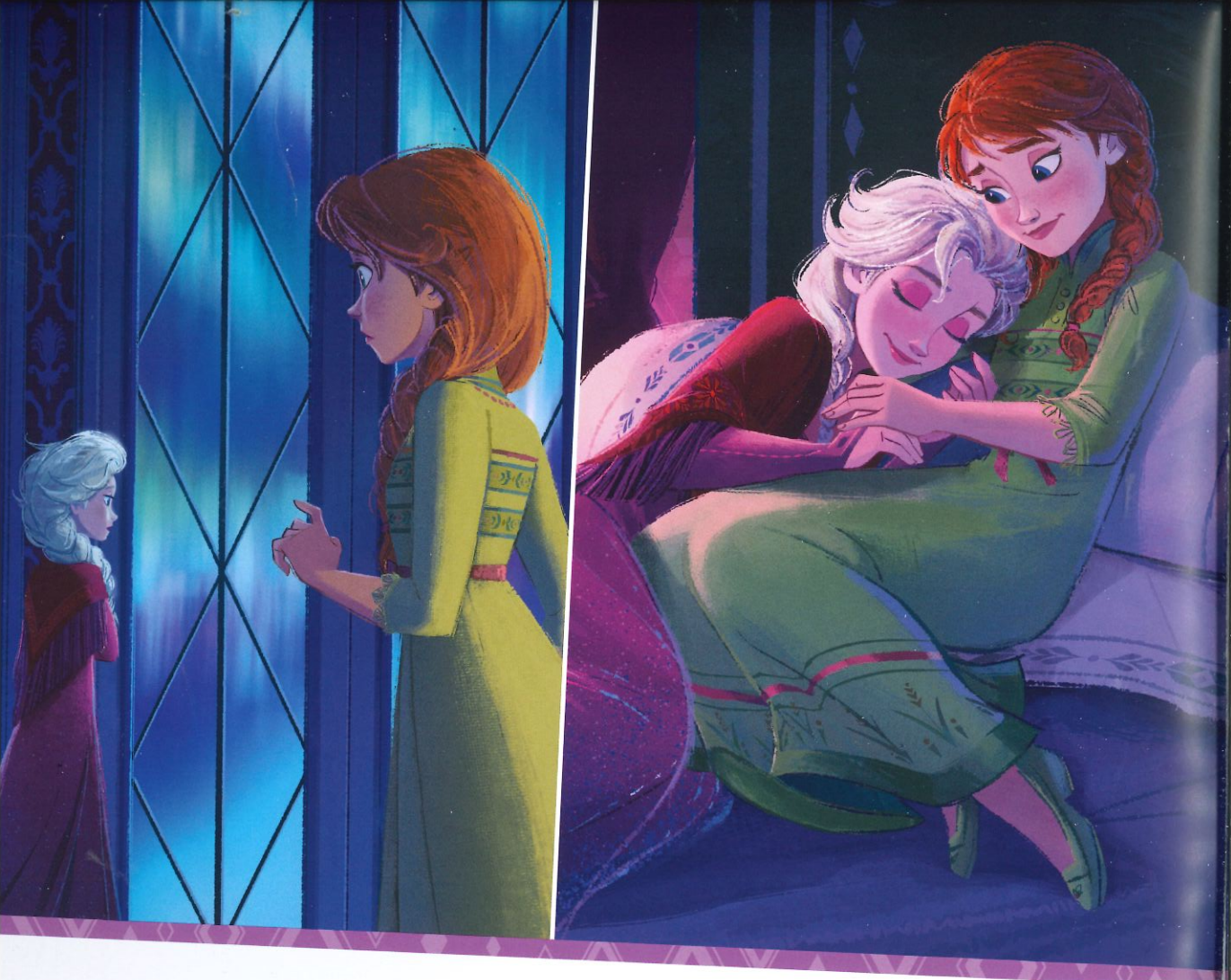
One evening, Elsa, Anna, Olaf, Kristoff, and Sven, are playing games in the castle. They're having fun. Suddenly, Elsa stops.

There's a voice, but only she can hear it.

"Are you okay?" Anna asks.

"A little ... tired," Elsa answers.





Anna follows Elsa to her room. Elsa is wearing their mother's scarf.

"What's wrong?" Anna asks.

"There's this ..." but Elsa can't tell Anna about the voice. She sings to Anna—their mother's song about Ahtohallan. It's a magic river that holds stories of the past. They fall asleep.

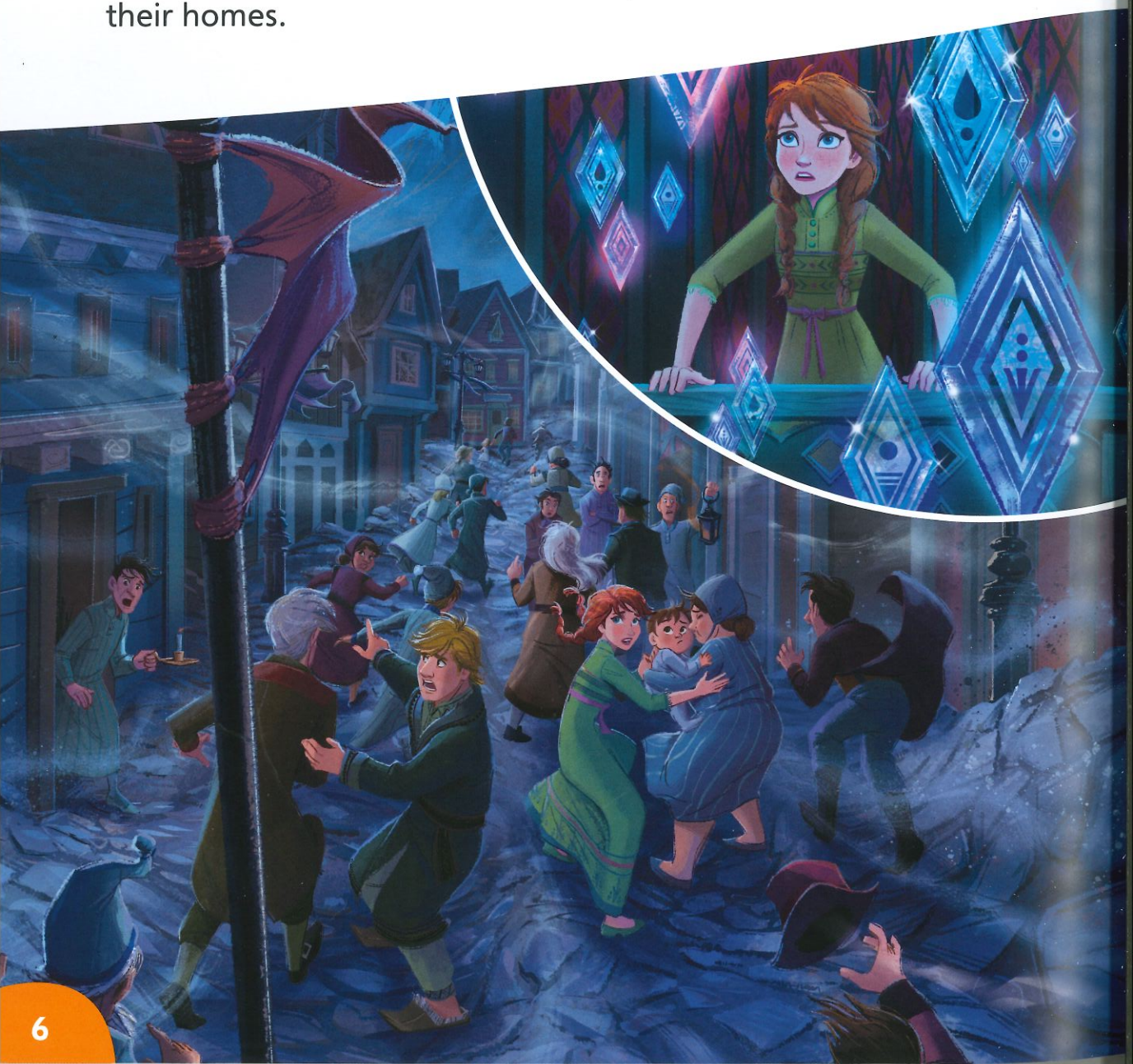


Elsa wakes! She hears the voice again. This time, she follows it outside. Elsa uses her magic. She changes the snow into beautiful ice shapes. She can see pictures in them.

“Wind, Fire, Water, Earth!” Elsa wakes the spirits of nature.

Back at the castle, Anna sees the same ice shapes. She doesn't understand what's happening. Now ice shapes are falling from the sky. *CRASH!*

There's no water or light. The ground suddenly moves. In Arendelle, people are afraid. They're running from their homes.





Elsa's friend, Grand Pabbie, arrives. "The spirits are angry," he says. "Understand the past, then you can save Arendelle." Elsa feels strong, "I have to go to the Enchanted Forest and find that voice."

"You're hearing voices?" Kristoff asks.

"Not voices, a voice," Elsa says.



Kristoff and Anna don't like this idea.

"We have to come with you!" Anna says.

"I can stay and help the people of Arendelle," Grand Pabbie says kindly.

Early the next morning, Elsa, Anna, Kristoff, Olaf, and Sven go north.

The next day, they arrive at a wall of mist.

“I hear the voice!” Elsa shouts.

They run through the mist. Elsa stops in front of four large rocks. She remembers these pictures of the spirits. The same ones were on the ice shapes.





Suddenly, the Wind Spirit pushes the friends into the forest. Elsa uses her magic to stop the wind. Snow from her hands makes ice shapes appear. They see their young father and a Northuldra girl in the ice. She's saving him. Who *is* she?



There's a noise—Northuldra people appear from the trees. Then Arendellians appear! They fight. Elsa uses her magic, and she stops the fight. The people are surprised.

"I am Queen of Arendelle," Elsa says, "I want to help you leave the forest."



Suddenly, a ball of fire flies at them. The Fire Spirit! The people run. Elsa uses her magic and stops the spirit. A small, friendly animal appears.

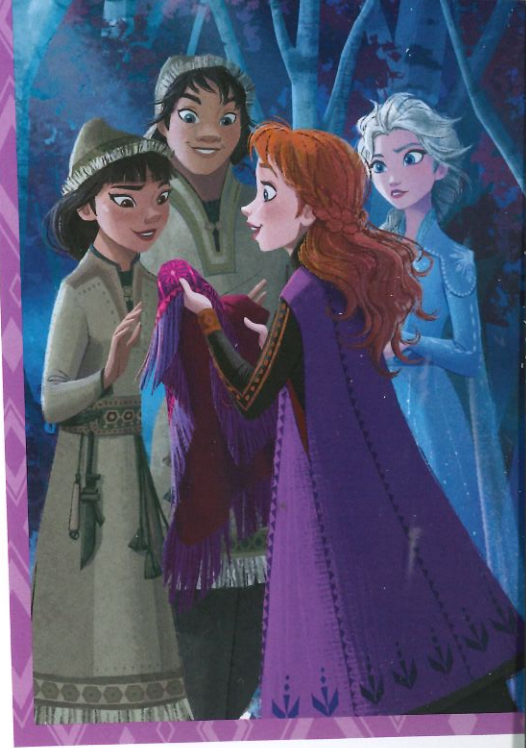
Anna was afraid of the fire. Elsa puts her mother's scarf around her sister.



“That’s a Northuldra scarf,” a man says. Now the sisters understand—the Northuldra girl in the ice was their mother!

There are pictures of the spirits on the scarf. There’s also a fifth spirit—a bridge between the magic of nature and people. They have to find that bridge.

They go north and see a boat.





Inside the boat, they find a map. There's a river called Ahtohallan. It's the river from their mother's song—it holds stories of the past.

Elsa has to find Ahtohallan, but not with Anna. It's very dangerous.

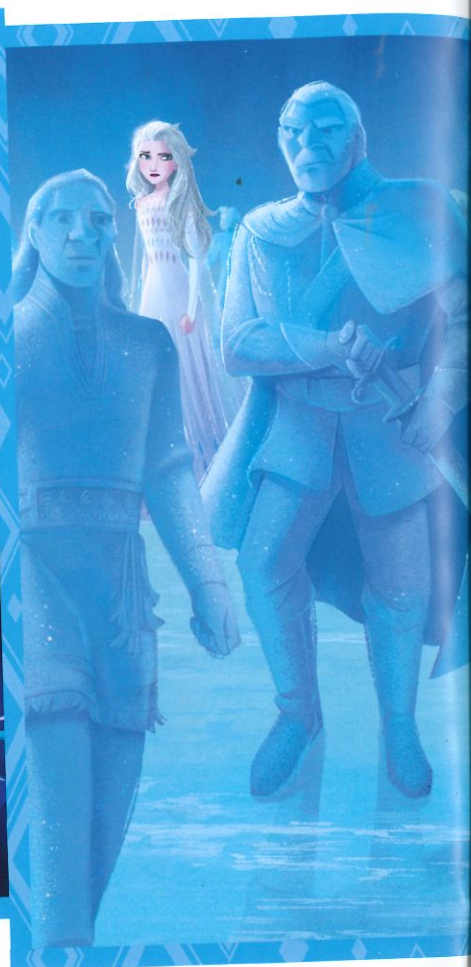
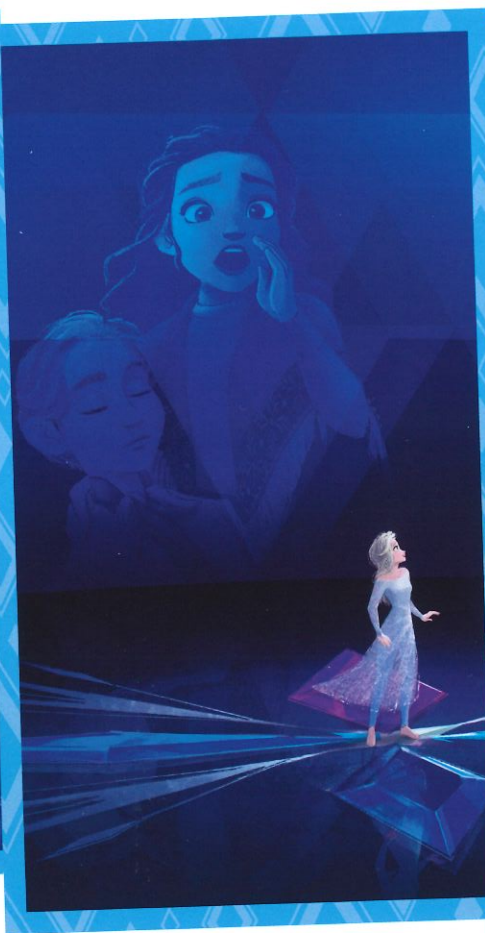


Elsa arrives at the Dark Sea.

Suddenly, there's a water horse—
it's the Water Spirit! It's angry and
they fight. Elsa jumps on the horse
and they ride across the Dark Sea.



Elsa arrives at Ahtohallan—the magic river is a glacier!
The voice is calling her.



Suddenly, pictures of her mother and her grandfather, King Runeard of Arendelle, appear on the walls of ice. It's true—Ahtohallan *does* hold stories of the past!

Her grandfather hated the Northuldra. He didn't make the dam because they were friends. He wanted to *hurt* them! Elsa uses her magic. The ice shows Anna what happened. Anna shouts, "The dam has to fall!" She wants to make things right again.





Her idea is to use the Earth Spirit.

“Wake up!” Anna shouts at the Earth Giants.

They become angrier and angrier. She runs to the dam. The Earth Giants throw things at Anna and the dam starts to fall.

Her idea is dangerous, but it’s working!



Anna's afraid. Now all the water from the dam is running straight to Arendelle! But Elsa appears and makes a wall of ice.

Suddenly, it's sunny again in the Enchanted Forest. The Northuldra can leave, and they can smile again.

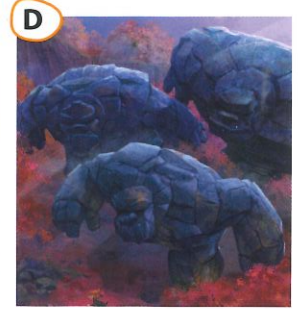
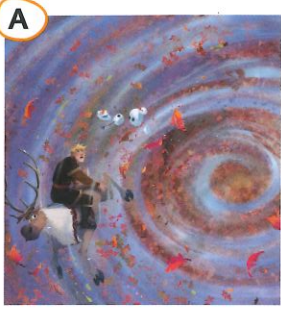

What do you know about glaciers?

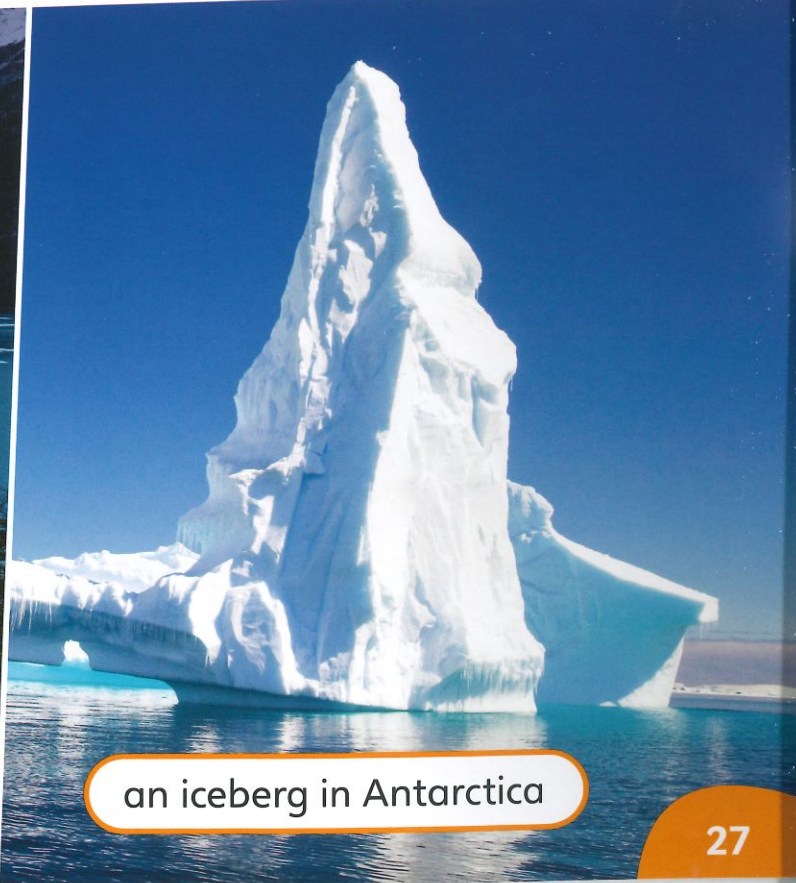
Glaciers are very big rivers of ice. They're moving slowly all the time. Some glaciers move 25 centimeters a day. Some glaciers move 30 meters a day. That's a big difference. But we can't see this with our eyes. There are a lot of glaciers in Antarctica, Greenland, and Alaska. But you can find them in cold places all over the world.

thousand the number 1,000
centimeter (cm) / meter (m) 100 centimeters = 1 meter
kilometer (km) 1,000 meters = 1 kilometer

Fast Facts

- Some glacier ice is more than a hundred thousand (100,000) years old.
- Lambert Glacier, in Antarctica, is 400 kilometers long.
- 69 percent of water comes from glaciers. Perhaps there's some water from a glacier in your glass right now ...
- An iceberg is ice from a glacier.
